Ramping up text difficulty in Kindergarten and Grade 1 would mainly mean using rarer words, repeating them less often, and obscuring the consistency of their spelling patterns. That means making the texts more difficult to read (lower comprehension) AND impeding student learning progress (slowing the students' grasp of decoding).

A text is complex if it's above students' independent reading level. Fisher and Frey (2012) suggest these measures may be unreliable for primary students. When considering readability measures like lexile levels, Gail Gibbons or Patricia Polacco texts are examples of quantitative complexity for primary students.

Promote Deep Thinking! How to Choose a Complex Text ...

One of the critically mentioned components of the Common Core is the complex text. This need for complex text came out of studies that students were not arriving at college ready to read college-level texts independently. The Common Core documents also indicate other reasons and rationale. One of the most startling claims is: "Despite steady or growing reading demands from various sources, K-12 reading texts have actually trended downward in difficulty in the last half century."

The more complex the text, the more support students will need. Students are introduced to increasingly complex texts throughout middle and high school. This is done through a gradual release of responsibility where complex texts are

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introduced in the most supportive context through reading to students and shared reading.

Complex Text Archives - Keys to Literacy

From 3rd grade on, Reading Standard 10 asserts that students will "read and comprehend complex literary and informational texts independently and proficiently at the high end of the grade-level text complexity band" (NGA Center & CCSSO, 2010a, p. 10). Reading Standard 10 is a critical standard in the Common Core.

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Complex Text for Beginning Readers ... Good Idea or Not

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Examples of appropriately complex texts in the Kindergarten materials include: In Module 1, Lesson 6, students listen to *A Squiggly Story* by Andrew Lauren, which has a Lexile measure of 490 and is considered moderately complex. The text shifts between two different storylines and has a plot that is difficult to predict.

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
